As Historians we will...

use a range of sources to make observations about the past whilst carefully identifying unreliable sources. We will know that the Gunpowder Plot was a significant event in History and that the actions of Guy Fawkes are the reason we celebrate Bonfire Night. We will learn about Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale and compare their lives and work in the Crimean War. We will develop an understanding of conflicts faced as a result of societal beliefs. We will be able to demonstrate an understanding of the chronological timeline in which our heroes existed and know that the legacy of these

continue to gain an understanding of a wide variety of living things and distinguish between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive. We will make predictions, observations and ask questions to enable us to classify and group objects, based on data collected. We will recognise and explain reasons for classifying living things in certain habitats and identify a variety of plants and animals. We will investigate why specific living things are suited to certain habitats.
